Psalm 25:1-10

P: I pray to you, my Lord; I trust in you, my God.

**C: Don't let me suffer the humiliation of not getting an answer from you; don't give others the opportunity to gloat over the uselessness of my trust in you.**

P: Don't let anyone who trusts in you suffer for their confident faith; if anyone is to be humiliated let it be the doubters.

**C: Help me to understand you better and better, my Lord; teach me all about yourself.**

P: Train me to live as your disciple; for you are my Saviour, and I want to live my whole life trusting you.

**C: Don't ever forget your promises, my Lord, to be loving and merciful; promises you have already kept for ages.**

P: Don't remember the misdeeds of my youth, or my continuing disobedience; but in your constant love and reliable mercy, my Lord, remember me now.

**C: The Lord is good and just; he teaches the disobedient how to obey him; he guides the lowly on the right path; and trains them in obedience.**

**All: All that the Lord does shows his love and loyalty to those who live within his covenant.**

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

*The parable of the good Samaritan*

An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbour as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while travelling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.'

Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise." This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**C: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!**

The Nicene Creed

**C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the**

**Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

**C: We pray for our country and for all who teach others. Send good neighbours to speak the truth in love. Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer.**

**C: We pray for our community and our families, and for those who suffer trouble and grief, or who are sick and dying. Feel their pain Lord, and send them good neighbours to comfort and give practical help. Move us to love our neighbours by spending time with them, inviting them into our homes, and sharing your mercy to us with them. Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer.**

**C: We pray for all who journey on the road of growth in the Christian faith. Teach them well, and send them the Good Samaritan of their souls to give them eternal life through faith in him. Make us all loving neighbours to those we know to be in special need, and whom we now name silently in our hearts...Brief pause. Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer.**

**C: Father, teach us to see your own dear Son in the face of all who suffer. May we be your instruments of love and healing in the world. We ask this through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**


***Praise the Lord, rise up rejoicing,
